IMPORTANT: at the welcoming area, in Village de Corail, a dedicated area will be arranged for the teams to store their equipment. These will be opened at daytime and closed for the night.

On this same area, at Village de Corail, an area will also be secured and kept for the teams to leave their personal belongings during the race.



ARWC 2018 Race information

General information

A prolog race will establish a ranking then use to determine the start order.

A sleeping card **of 12h** will be mandatory. The stop can be of **1/2h minimum to 4h maximum** in a row and must be taken on CP's or TA's.

All teams, that will not withdraw will be finishing the race. There will be only one final ranking. Each team will receive an endowment, depending on our partners.

7th November in the morning, teams must have given their race equipment (4 bike boxes, 2 equipment boxes and one paddle-bag) and their personal bags (not compulsory) to the organisation before 11 am.

Teams will no longer have access to their equipment until the race start. Teams will leave around 11:30 am (not defined) to go to Hell-Bourg with the organisation buses (mandatory).

Nations parade

Upon their arrival in Hell-Bourg, each team will be waited by one child with a flag (team's nationality) and wearing a bib with the team's number. Teams will have 30 minutes maximum to meet their new team-mate and learn how to practice the «Kours la rou». Then, teams will join the prolog's start line in a parade.

Prolog

A «Kours la rou» (game played by the children of Reunion Island and Mayotte) consists in rolling a wheel (a car tyre) with 2 sticks as fast as possible without never pushing the wheel with the hands. The route, a loop in Hell-Bourg, will be in 5 relays. Each relay is taken by a different team member and the last one is imperatively the child of the team. To finish this route, the child will also have to do a «goni» (bag race) to cross the finish line. At each relay pass, each team-mate continues to follow the relayer so that on the finish line the entire team is together. Several teams will run together in the order of their number sign.

Following the prolog, teams will have time to discover the wonderful Hell-Bourg village and its inhabitants. From 6:30 pm, a local meal will be shared with all the teams and the organisation, the partners and the guests. Teams accompanying persons can book (see booking file) to participate to this friendly before race moment. A local music show will be offered during the meal.

All the teams will sleep during the night before the start of the race in two buildings located in Hell-Bourg. These buildings are simple sports halls and are reserved for racers only. There is toilets and water on site.

For accompanying persons, there are possibilities of lodging on the village (see accommodation).



<u>Legs</u>

The 430 km route will be composed of 10 legs and 9 Transition areas (TA). Each stage can include several activities (ropes during a trek, trek and ropes during a packraft, horse riding during mountain bike, etc). During some legs you will be obliged to wear complementary material in addition to the one of the main activity. An expedition... The course will be composed of 162 km of trek complemented of some parts of ropes and canyons, 182 km of MTB, 78 km of packrafts and sea kayaks and 12 km of horse riding (if this activity is established).

There are 4 trekking legs and walking parts during other activities (packraft, MTB), 3 legs of MTB and 2 legs of boats. Other activities are in the middle of the stages (ropes, caving, horse).

Trek: the Reunion Island is an amazing playground, especially for this kind of event. Progressing, even on tracks, can be tough and complicated. The pace is often slow and the vegetation is very, very dense. For the major part of the island, it's tropical vegetation. During some parts, it will be necessary to forget your usual reference progression times and the maps paths notions. About your clothes, long legs pants are highly recommended on specific stage, particularly of trek under the risk of "deep and painful scratches" along the race. Idem, we advise you to always have with you a pair of gloves as to "gardening" during the treks. In Reunion Island, there is the "vigne maronne" terribly aggressive for the skin. To this day, trekking poles are allowed.

Orienteering: The maps scale will be 1/50 000. However, the progression complexity, makes that we will give you 1/25 000 maps. **Many kilometers without kite or CP, some difficult choices**

can be predicted.

The weather is often changing a lot, and most of the time, a very thick fog takes the island summits... Good orienteering skills without good visibility will certainly be a plus for a team. GPS are forbidden especially GPS watches and MTB GPS meters.

MTB: the MTB sections will be especially diversified, the island being fully composed of various treasures. However, be prepared for long uphill portions and some mountain technical MTB (single tracks, mud, banked tracks...). MTB won't be neglected during those world championship.



Canyoning: canyoning is one of the most famous activities on the island; it's also a worldwide well-known area to practice this activity. Good ropes skills and a good knowledge of canyons environment are necessary in order to have a peaceful progression and to really enjoy the section.

Caving: caving on the island is very special and fantastic. You will, for example, discover tunnels of lava. Those tunnels were made during the numerous eruptions of the Piton de la Fournaise volcano. Those areas are very delicate, and you will need to be very careful. As usual on Raid in France, the progression during caving section will be made with a blocked time, so that everyone can enjoy the place.

Ropes activities and mountaineering: during this world championship, you will be discovering some incredible rope sessions. As for canyoning and caving, a good knowledge and skills in the activity will allow you to enjoy better those very special moments.

Sea kayak: Reunion is an island and its coasts must be discovered from the open sea. Sea kayak will be practiced out of the lagoons. Night navigation will be forbidden during this activity. The boats are Océan Quatro of the brand RTM. They are approved for navigation up to 2 miles from the coast. Even if night navigation is forbidden, teams will must have with them the mandatory equipment to navigate by night in case they are obliged to finish their navigation at eventide. As in packraft, wearing a backpack is forbidden. You have to plan what to tie your bags in the kayaks in case of rollover.

Horse riding: Many horses are present (more than 2000) on the island and this activity should be on the program. This moment will be the occasion to enjoy, without effort, to discover a magical place, out of time and unique. This activity will be in blocked time, the same for everybody, in route following and orientation. Each team will have 4 horses. The confirmation of this activity will be given very quickly. The progression will be 24h/24h, a part in route following and another part in orientation.

We don't ask horse riding certificate but we are counting on you to train to avoid falls and especially don't hurt the horse. A simple sworn declaration that you have basic knowledge in horse riding and that you are able to progress on horseback in autonomy will be requested. You can find the declaration on the website.



Packraft: during ARWC 2018, white water sections will be covered with packrafts. **Packraft night navigation will be forbidden on some rivers, the management of these obligatory stops will have to be taken into account to optimize the break times. Teams will potentially must stop to spend the night along the river. The night progress along the river will be forbidden except on specific areas.** Route recognition has already been made with those boats, and, in our opinion really upgrade the sections with an adventurous spirit, in terms of navigating choices, but also the diversity of opportunities (inaccessible areas otherwise than walking). You will be able to progress with single or double packrafts, every option is possible, and it's your own team's decision. Regarding all the questions around the requirements for the packrafts for ARWC 2018, we are willing to clarify few things.

Our one and only aim: racers security. It's our responsibility to tying to guarantee it as much as we can. After several recognitions on the island's rivers and our experience as racers, it appeared mandatory to settle different rules regarding this leg. We aren't doing it just for fun, the idea is to guarantee each team to have a boat corresponding to the riversstandards (class III or more with a lot of water) and not a «toy» boat. In France, it's forbidden to keep your backpack while navigating (moreover, it's actually dangerous!), therefore, you need enough space in the boats to put: 2 racers, 2 backpacks, 1 paddle bag and equipment. In addition, all this is heavy. Taking in account all the remarks, and to allow as much as possible packrafts owners to their equipment, we have requested opinions from professionals (several time kayaking world champions) and the new requirements (rules) are: Manufactured packrafts: characteristics available on internet. Two people packrafts: referenced as for two people and with a minimum length of 2.72 m, otherwise, they will be considered as single ones.

3 m external and 2 m (preconisations) for the inside length seems to be the minimum sizing for a double packraft in order to progress with minimum comfort and technical conditions (with your equipment). We will only tolerate manufactured boats.



The organisation will set up a bulk purchase of those types of boats, meeting the race rules. It will be the boats that have been used during recognition. We have been testing one single and two double packrafts. For us, the 3.5 m boats were the most interesting boats for this kind of water and legs: weight, comfort, speed on flat waters, manoeuvrability in rapids and space for equipment.

Wearing a backpack during white water section is forbidden.

Very important: During the navigation parts, no help will be given from the organization to potentials packraft repairs. Teams must be completely autonomous to repair their boats. In the view of the problematics that you will meet during the packraft, demountable paddles are mandatory.

Keep on mind that the kind of progress that you will face during the packraft will be nature expedition adventure with different kinds of progress: the navigation of course but also the walking and the progression on ropes. You will have to carry your whole equipment. A substantial repair kit will be added to the mandatory equipment list. Glue and 2 repair strips (patches) 50cm length and wide of 6cm. Pumps non-working with human energy are forbidden (electric pump for example).

Entries

For the 2018 Adventure Racing World Championship, there will be 75 spots available and that will be distributed using the following criteria.

Distribution of entries

Winners of qualifiers

Winners of each AR World Series Qualifier and the winner of AR World Championship 2017 are receiving a guaranteed spot and free entry to AR World Championship 2018.

Qualifier winning entries may not be passed down to another team if the winning team does not race at the ARWC. If a Qualifier winner has already paid for an entry fee through the WORLD RANKING TEAM ENTRY or WILD CARD ENTRY they will be refunded this fee. Qualifier winners must race the AR World Championship with a minimum of two members of the team who won entry. In the situation that a winning team of a Qualifier already holds a free entry, then the free entry is passed to the next eligible team.

Qualifier winner must race the AR World Championship with a minimum of two members of the team who won entry. In the situation that the winning team already holds a free entry, then the free entry is passed to the next eligible team. Fee paid by ARES Series.

Entries for teams in the World Ranking

30 entries are opened on February 1, 2018 during one week (close on February 8, 2018) to teams with an AR World Ranking for a discounted price (4500 euros per team entry). If more teams register for these entries than there are spots available, then the teams with the highest rankings are chosen to fill these spots.

A team AR World Ranking is based on their ranking on the day entries are opened. Teams chosen for a WORLD RANKING TEAM ENTRY have 7 days to make full payment of entry fees to the organiser after the world ranking team entries are closed. If they fail to do so, they forfeit this spot and it is passed to another team. Teams who forfeit or miss out on a WORLD RANKING TEAM ENTRY and then obtain an OPEN ENTRY must pay the full open entry entry fee.

In order to be eligible to the Team World Ranking, the team must comprise at least two participants whose names already appear on the world ranking list of the team. These terms and conditions are valid until the beginning of the race. Otherwise, the team will be on the waitlist and shall be subject to the Open Entry conditions.

Open entries

The remaining entries (30) are opened on March 1st, 2018 at 2 PM (French Time - Caution: only emails dating from March 1st at 2 PM or later will be considered) as open entries spots to any team on first in basis. If a team missed out on a WORLD RANKING TEAM ENTRY they may have one of these spots. Any WORLD RANKING TEAM ENTRY that was not filled will become available as an OPEN ENTRY. The entry fee is 5000 Euros per team. Teams chosen for an OPEN ENTRY have 14 days to make full payment of entry fees to the organiser, after this time teams lost their open entry and they are placed on waitlist.

If the open entries are all booked, a waitlist will be generated on a first-come, first-served basis. A refundable 300€ deposit is required to remain on the waitlist. If you are added to the waitlist, information will be emailed to you on how to pay the deposit. In the event a spot opens up, information will be sent to the team captain on how to complete team registration. Registration must be completed with full payment within 14 days to keep the spot.



Wild card entry

5 spots are given to the organiser, in order to allow local or foreign teams to be represented. Those sports will be handed regarding the previous enrolments and the general context. The price for those sports is, as for open entries, 5000€.

Teams who have registered and later earn a free entry from an ARWS qualifier will have their fees refunded.

Additional spots may open up based on claimed entries from ARWS qualifier spots and permitting.

If a team gets its spot through an ARWS qualifier and has not then yet registered for ARWC 2018, that team will be given instructions on how to contact us to register.

Teams with special interest

Can apply separately to the above through emailing the organisation directly at <u>concurrent@raidinfrance.fr</u>

Team's numbers will be official after Ecuador Series at the end of July.

Regulation regarding the team nationality

Teams at the AR World Championship must include a minimum of three members of the same nationality. Competitors will prove their nationality at race registration by officials checking their passport is valid and issued by the country the team is representing. Competitors representing their country of residence, if different to their passport, must show suitable proof of residency. Teams at the AR World Championship will represent one designated nation only, being the nationality of the majority of team members.



Teams requirements

All racers must be age 18 years or older. Each team must represent one country.

Each team must contain a minimum of 3 members from the same country, as proven by a valid passport or residency documents at race registration.

Teams that do not contain 3 members from the same nation may be permitted to race at the race host's discretion but are not eligible to receive an official ARWS ranking, including the winning of any prizes. If a competitor has multiple valid passports from different countries (e.g., dual nationality), the participant can choose the nationality of one of those passports and represent that country.

The first part of every team name must contain the name of the nation the team is representing and then be followed by a unique team sponsor's name or identifier or your country's three-letter code (e.g., Australia Mountain Designs or AUS Mountain Designs). Multiple teams representing the same country are permit.

The organization requires a deposit cheque or an imprint of the credit card within the time of administrative checks.

In order to participate, all teams must hand in a deposit.

The aim of this guarantee is to financially cover any degradation, loss or disappearance of the organisation's equipment used by the racers and team-reporters.

This deposit is given back to the team at the end of the race following satisfactory equipment inspection. The amount of this deposit is: 1000€ Reminder: Teams will have to provide the aptitude certificates (available on the website of the race) signed by a professional of the activity, during the before race verifications. Make sure you have the original and a copy to give to the organisation.

Equipment placed at your disposal by the organization

- The rules and documents to prepare the race
- 2 sets of maps: 1/50 000 and/or 1/25000 (per team)
- 1 set of road book and 1 passport (per team)
- 1 GPS beacon (per team)
- 1 SIM card to be inserted in a mobile phone (per team)
- Some necessary sport equipment : 2 two persons kayaks (per team)
- 4 race bibs.



Insurance

The event organizers have public liability insurance. This is a compulsory insurance policy in France for events that are organised on, or cross through, any form of government land/public place. This, however, is not personal accident insurance for you! It is strongly recommended you to have your own personal accident insurance. Insurance covering: medical expenses, searches, rescue and repatriation expenses is highly recommended by the organisation and is mandatory for foreign teams. Racers on hold of a Triathlon racing licence must show it to the organisation and provide us with a duplicate.

Refund, transfer and cancelation policies

Teams may officially cancel their entry at any stage prior to the event by emailing the race organizers: <u>concurrent@raidinfrance.fr</u>

Registered teams canceling before May 15, 2018 receive 100% refund minus 400€ administration fee.

Registered teams canceling before July 15, 2018 receive 50% refund. Registered teams canceling after July 15, 2018 no refund under any circumstances.

Teams are welcome to transfer or sell their entry to another team if available. This will be a transaction between the teams and Raid in France will not take part in the transaction. Raid in France must be notified as soon as possible and team details must be updated by email: <u>concurrent@raidinfrance.fr</u>

If the entry transfer occurs between a World Ranking Team and an open entry team, an additional entry fee (500€) will be paid by the new team to Raid in France.

If two teams do not have sufficient members and decide to join together, this will be strictly considered as one team canceling their entry.

Refund policy will be as stated above, no exceptions.

If any member of your team fails the basic competency checks, the whole team will be disqualified and no refund will be given.

Exact details of competencies are being promulgated on this web site and in the competitor information packs.

Failure to make payments on the designated dates may result in cancelation of your entry and no refund of money paid to that date. If the race is cancelled due to acts of god, natural disasters, terrorism or other reasons etc, the organizers will make every effort to refund as much of the entry fee as possible to all teams. The race will not be rescheduled.

IMPORTANT: November is a very busy month in terms of tourism for the island. Travelling to the island, accommodation bookings and rentals can get really tough and expensive if you don't plan your trip long in advance. Our advice is to do it as soon as possible and not to wait the last moment to make all the bookings.

Information regarding the shuttles and the equipment

The organization will set up some shuttles (only for the equipment) from Saint-Denis's airport to the Village Corail, teams welcoming area. Some shuttles will also be organized for the way back. The booking sheet will be online, so that teams can book.

Shuttles will be organised on the 2nd, the 3rd and the 4th of November 2018 and on the 17th and 18th November 2018 for the way back.

The organization's shuttles are only booked for the equipment (bike boxes, bags or boxes). They will be 2 shuttles a day. It will be possible to leave your equipment in the morning from 8 am to 12 pm and in the afternoon from 4 pm to 8 pm. For the planes arriving later, contact Béatrice (<u>concurrent@raidinfrance.fr</u>) to organize the transfer. For the racers, there are public shuttles named « Car Jaunes » which serve the Village de Corail from the Airport.



For the teams interested in buying packrafts, we have negotiated the best conditions as possible for you with our partner FRONTIER Audac Sport. You can directly contact Karen (<u>info@audacsports.com</u>) by presenting yourself as a team from the ARWC2018. Purchases are directly made with the manufacturer.

For buying bike boxes, we currently have a limited quantity of available boxes. According to the number of requests, we will order or not new boxes. Boxes will be affected in the demand order.

You will not have to lift your paddle bag during the navigation legs. The maximum weight is 30 kg. In the paddle bag you will have to put: packrafts, life jackets, demountable paddles, helmets (if not multisports). These bags are not waterproof and their dimensions are 1,5m x 0,5m (diameter).

The paddle-bags allowed are the ARWC circuit ones (see picture).



Organization will provide 2 boxes to each team.

One:110 liters (85cmx49cmx39cm) Maximum weight allowed : 25 kg One: 85 liters (75cmx45cmx39cm) Maximum weight allowed 22kg.



The bike boxes allowed weight is 28 kg.

Additional precisions

Helmets:

Some teams are using multi-activities helmets. This year, helmets must be approved for these activities: MTB, rapids, ropes (canyoning, caving, climbing...). Some helmets, previously approved are not anymore as Météor IV while the III is. To our knowledge, currently are approved: Météor III and only the III, Caso Gams, Bios Instinct, Kong Scarab... maybe others are approved but we recommend to check that with the organisation before leaving for Reunion Island.

Orientation:

Maps: all the maps and roadooks provided by the organisation are waterproof.

Compass: Be careful, compass have to be South Hemisphere compass otherwise they are badly or not working at all.

GPS watches are prohibited.



Reminder:

For the teams who didn't returned the pre-booking file, they must do it as quickly as possible. After 15th June, no one booking will be done. From 21th June, the definitive file will be sent to the teams who notified their needs, with the possibilities and the definitives prices.

Practical information and travel tips

Currency

The Island is a French department, therefore the money is euro. You will be able to exchange money at the airport or in cash machines. However, we advise you to get in touch with your personal bank to see what are the best deals and options. They may vary a lot within banks or countries.

<u>Time zone</u>

RET (UTC+04). That is to say, with France, you will have 3 hours of difference. When it's 3pm in Paris, its 6pm on the island. Be aware of potential jet lag!

Climate

Reunion Island is in the southern hemisphere. If your country is in the northern hemisphere, you will need to flip the seasonality timing to get it right! Knowing the proximity with the Capricorn topic, the island's climate is tropical. Due to the ocean, the temperature on the coast varies: between 18° to 31°C (65° to 88°F). However, on the opposite, in high altitude, it can drop to 4°C (39°F) and rarely rise above 25°C (77°F). It can even drop under 0°C (32°F) in high mountains. Moreover, you must note that, for sure, it's raining very often...

Mobile phones/Cell services

Since 2016, there aren't any more roaming fees between Dom-Tom and the French mainland. Moreover, since June 2017, a European traveller with a mobile phone service will be able to use his phone normally as in the 27 countries member of the EU without any added tax. Threshold have however been set by the mobile operators, you need to give it a check. The agreement on fees also includes the 3G and 4G data consumption. The global volume available depends on your national service plan. We advise you, especially non-European racers, to check it all up before and find deals with operators.



Electricity

The voltage and the electrical frequency is the same as in the French mainland. (230V and 50Hz). You can therefore use the same electrical devices, as there. Plugs are E type. Again, it's the same as in the French mainland. If you are international, you will need to get an adaptor.

<u>Health</u>

The only real dangers on Reunion Island are the sun, mosquitoes and sharks. There aren't any venomous animals on the island. You could encounter grater snakes, it's harmless, such as little spiders you can find inside buildings (bibes) and larger ones outside (babouks). A big centipede locally called « cent pieds » (one hundred feet) have a painful sting, scorpions too but they aren't deadly. On the island, mosquitoes do not transmit malaria but they can spread other diseases, such as Chikungunya. Be in possession of a good mosquito repellent.

You also need to beware of some uncommon fishes: some of them have a toxin in their flesh that may cause disorder (paralysis, blood pressure dropping, itching, tingling, dizziness...). They are called ciguatera or «gratte». Avoid eating fish without the advice of a local resident.

<u>Sharks</u>

Since February 2017, the Reunion administration has ruled and regulated bathing and some water activities in an area of 300 m from the shore. Bathing and water activities are allowed in the lagoon. Outside the lagoon they are allowed only in equipped and monitored areas: operational experimental areas.

Don't underestimate sunburn. It shines brightly especially between 11 am and 3 pm even if it's cloudy or foggy in the mountains, and especially when heading to the volcano.

You must be up to date on your vaccines (Tetanus, Polio, Diphtheria, hepatitis A and B). There is no rabies or yellow fever. Be in possession of your health documents. For European citizens, except from French citizen, you will be able to obtain the European Health Insurance Card. We recommend you to make this card.


