The 2024 course

A 463 km loop with 10,300 m of elevation gain

This loop will include 13 sections.

The order of the sections and their characteristics are as follows:

- Packtaft/trek1: 17km 130 m ascent, 320 m descent
- Umber 1: 41km 1070m ascent 830m descent
- UTrek1: 13km 610m ascent 510m descent
- Packtaft/trek2: 14km 770m ascent 770m descent
- UMOUNTAIN Bike2: 89km 1650m ascent 1460m descent
- Packtaft/trek3: 25km 50m ascent 310m descent
- UTrek/ropes2: 11km 340m ascent 480m descent
- Packtaft/trek4: 64km 1050m ascent 870m descent
- Mountain Bike3: 31km 510m ascent 560m descent
- Packtaft/trek5: 35km 700m ascent 1170m descent
- : Trek3: 41km 1420m ascent 1160m descent
- Packraft1: 7km 0 ascent 0 descent
- Mountain Bike4: 75km 2000m ascent 1860m descent

For the packraft/trek sections, our estimates indicate approximately 50 km of trekking and 105 km of pack rafting.

Currently, river conditions are optimal, with water levels allowing navigation on very beautiful, accessible rivers. There is one month left before the start of the race...

We had indicated a whitewater skill level with potentially class 4 rapids, but this will not be the case due to local permission and constraints. The maximum average level will be class 3 if conditions remain the same. The latest information will be provided in real time based on the weather.



General organisation

The general program is provided on the Raid in France website. It is mandatory to be on-site by Friday, June 28th at the latest for technical verification.

The team must be complete during the briefing and the bib distribution.

Teams will have until early Saturday, June 29th to prepare their equipment for the duration of the race. The race will start at 8:00 AM.

Transportation

The organisation offers a transport service between Lyon Airport (Saint Exupery) and the start and finish location (Bugeat) on Wednesday, June 26th in the late afternoon and a return on the morning of July 6th. Foreign teams interested in this service should contact the organisation by email:

Race logistics

Mountain bike - We offer the sale of crates compliant with ARWS regulations and airline standards at the price of €165. These crates will be delivered at the start during verification or can be picked up in Lyon upon request. They are made of 5mm PPEA with a top opening and closed with 3 buckle straps.

Whitewater - Your «whitewater» bag must be able to contain, at minimum, all your mandatory equipment, including your paddles. No equipment attached to the outside of the bag will be accepted. For teams that wish, we sell bags with ARWS dimensions for the price of €100. Reservation can be made directly by email at concurrent@raidinfrance.fr.



<u>Packraft</u> - Regarding the characteristics of packrafts, we recommend double boats with a length between 3.2m and 3.5m, ideally with two buoyancy chambers and self-bailing features.

It is possible to rent packrafts and collapsible paddles directly from the CDCO of Corrèze at a price of €125 per boat for the week. The contact details will be available on the organisation's website in the Practical Information section.

The rest of the equipment will be transported in two crates provided by the organisation. Their characteristics are listed in the mandatory equipment list. The rotation schedule for this equipment will be provided one week before the start of the race.

Activities

<u>Reminder</u>: It is mandatory to use the standard medical certificate (compliant with French regulations) provided to you. No non-compliant certificates will be accepted, and the organisation's doctors will not be able to issue one for you.

Foreign teams must provide a repatriation insurance certificate. Insurance linked to credit cards is not accepted.

For all teams, both foreign and French, liability insurance for all activities as well as personal accident insurance are strongly recommended.

All French competitors licensed by FFTri and foreign competitors with a triathlon license from their country must send it to us as soon as possible by email to concurrent@raidinfrance.fr

Assistance and Rest time

The principle remains the same: 8 hours of mandatory rest to be taken only at CPs (Checkpoints) or ATs (Assistance Points) at the teams' convenience (in minimum blocks of 1/2 hour)..

This rest can only be taken at the exit of CPs or ATs (reminder: the equipment must have been handed over to the organisation and can no longer be touched).



Mandatory equipment

<u>Reminder</u>: Some mandatory equipment, mainly clothing and safety gear, may be marked during equipment checks (it is possible to have several pieces of the same type marked). During the race, any equipment without this mark will be considered non-compliant. This absence will result in a penalty, and if cheating is detected, immediate disqualification will occur.

Equipment for all disciplines

Bib: Provided by the organisation, it must remain free of any additions (stickers, etc.). It is offered at the end of the race.

Jacket: Two layers mean a membrane is bonded to the outer fabric; jackets with only one coating are not accepted. However, some ultralight 2-layer jackets are not reasonably suitable and may be too limited, especially in very bad weather. Teams must be fully autonomous in case of sudden weather deterioration and must be able to take shelter to wait for better weather. You may also be without shelter for very long hours..

Pants and others peaces clothing: same consideration. Whitewater: Individual Flotation Devices (Life Jackets)

Raid in France is part of the French Triathlon Federation and is subject to the technical safety rules (RTS) of this federation. For life jackets in packraft (inflatable boat), a standard is imposed starting from Class III: CE 12402-5 with reinforced buoyancy of 70N. Practically, this means that the accepted jackets in the race must have a label indicating the CE 12402-5 standard and the jacket's buoyancy:

- •70N for jackets used by a team member weighing over 60kg (size L/XL).
- •55N for jackets used by a team member weighing between 40 and 60kg (size S/M).

50N jackets are not regulatory.

For foreign teams, an equivalent standard can be sought. Please check with us prior for any validation.

Important : This year, the organisation will not provide paddles, helmets, or life jackets.
